
In the year two thousand and eighteen, the fourteenth day of September.

Before Timothy John Le Cocq, Esquire, Deputy Bailiff of Jersey, assisted by Jurats Sally Angela Sparrow, née Carter-Locke, and Suzanne Elizabeth Marett-Crosby, née Marett.

On the application of Simon Vivian, the President, (hereinafter “the applicant”) on behalf of the unincorporated Association known as the Channel Islands Racing and Hunt Club, and upon hearing the said applicant, the Court, in accordance with Article 4 of the “Loi (1862) sur les teneures en fidéicommis et l’incorporation d’associations”, as amended, granted an Act incorporating the said Association under the name of the Channel Islands Racing and Hunt Club and authorising the said Association to take, acquire, hold and possess in its corporate name all forms of property, both real and personal and wheresoever situate, in order that the objects of the said association may be achieved.

The applicant declared that the Secretary, Jonathan Perrée, or the applicant himself, are duly authorised to represent it in all matters both real and personal.

And the Court directed that a copy of the constitution of the said Association, produced by the applicant in support of this application, should be lodged at the Judicial Greffe and that a copy of the Act of Court should be registered in the Public Registry.
